What was Hurricane Helene?

How catastrophic was it?

As of September 2024, Hurricane Helene is a Category 4 hurricane that has passed through much of the Atlantic Ocean and has moved north-

westward toward the Cape Verde Islands. In the United States, six states have

been hit with devastation; these include Florida, Georgia, North and South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. There have been almost 150 mass casualties and communities throughout the east coast have been destroyed.

Power lines have crashed upon in-nocent families and floods have swamped

homes. To say the least, this catastrophe is something we will be trying to recover from for many years to come.

How did this heartbreaking event begin?

This hurricane began brewing in the Atlantic Ocean, and con-

tinued to grow in size as it headed to the Gulf of Mexico. At the storm's peak, it was 350 miles in radius, or 350 miles from the eve. When the eye began churning, it was relatively small. What shook us all was how rapidly it grew-increasing in speed by a minimum of 30 knots in 24 hours. Normally, hurri-



canes in the Gulf of Mexico increase by 10-15 miles per hour, but, this time, it was increasing by double. From the start, Hurricane Helene has been a monster.

Where is this vicious hurricane heading?

The storm was first in the Atlantic Ocean, just

above Honduras and the coast of South America.

After that, it moved North into the Yucatan Channel and up toward the States. While it was traveling through the Gulf of Mexico, the storm moved from a Category 1 hurricane to a Category two hur-

ricane and finally to a Category 3. In Florida is where the storm really started to

become dominant. Right under the Apalachicola National Forest is where it transitioned to a Category 4 hurricane. This continued throughout Florida. Following this, Georgia and the other four states were hit. Thankfully, the severity of the hurricane began to decline



as it traveled up the east coast. Sources say that it will not hit Pennsylvania or New York as a hurricane, but we will most likely get rain from the storm.

What effects will this have on people's everyday lives? What effect do we have on hurricanes?

Anyone who has heard about previous hurricanes knows how it can affect an everyday person's life. For the people of Asheville, North Carolina, their lives will never be the same. Houses have been torn down, electricity has been gone for almost a week. there is an extreme scarcity of food and water, and limited cellphone service. The Asheville airport reported 14 inches of rain over the span of three

Final Moments of the Titanic

In March, 1909 they started to build a ship. They said it would never sink, but they stood corrected.

In 1908, The RMS Olympic and sister ship, Titanic, was announced to be built. They started on March 31,

1909. Word started to go around that the Titanic was unsinkable.

Nowadays, it would seem weird to think a 50,000 ton ship

can't sink. On March 31, 1912 work on



the Titanic was finished. People were thrilled to hear the news! People all over the world were so excited to go on an adventure on this magnificent ship. Little did they know, half of them would lose their lives.

On April 10, of the same year, the passengers started to board the luxurious ship. The passengers were eager

to explore this magnificent ship since they all paid a lot of money to be able to say

they got to take the maiden voyage on the Titanic. A third class tick-

et cost seven pounds- which translates to about thirty-five dollars back then. In today's dollars the cost for a third class ticket would be \$1,135! That's a lot of money! First class tickets were 30 poundstranslated to \$150. In today's money it would be \$4,867! Imagine paying that much money for a trip across the ocean.

On April 14, seven different iceberg warnings were received by the crew of the Titanic. Of course, they ig-

nored them because they said, Titanic is un-

"the Titanic is unsinkable!" and "She's special!" They didn't think the icebergs were in the same area they were travel-

ing.
They also wanted to surprise the passengers

by going over the boat speed limit (which is a thing) to get there a day early. The iceberg warnings read like this.

Ice warning
10:55 p.m form
Californian
Ice report:
We are stopped
and surrounded
by ice.

You would think someone would be like, "Let's not go that way!" But, we can only guess what the crew and captain were thinking when they got those warnings. Once the Titanic was struck, 14

feet of water got into the front part of the boat. The captain called for help immediately and they started to get the lifeboats ready. Later they find out that the lifeboats can only hold half of the estimated passengers. In those days, they immediately let the women and children go first in the life boats.

On April 15 @12:25 a.m., the Carpathia picked up the distress call and was about 58 miles away from the disaster. At 12:45 the first lifeboat was safely lowered. Although it could hold 65 people, the lifeboats were not filled to capacity... At this time the first distress rocket was fired. There were eight rockets fired that night. 2:05 a.m the last lifeboat left the ship. There were still over 1,500 passengers left on

board the Titanic. At 2:17 the last radio message was sent. The captain announced, "Every man for himself!" Meaning they had a choice to jump and die, or wait for the Carpathia. At 2:20 a.m the Titanic was completely underwater. The Carpathia was still on its way and reached the survivors at 4:10 a.m. 705 survi-



vors were rescued by the Carpathia.

In total 1,514 people perished from the legendary ship. People have stories posted online about their experiences that are so incredibly interesting you don't want to stop reading.
